I believe that school districts should not have to make health decisions on their own as the coronavirus pandemic continues into the Fall semester. Because school administrators are not public health experts, they should not be expected to make the incredibly difficult and contentious decision to shut down a school or establish certain policies in response to the pandemic alone. Local health departments use their existing authority for other contagious outbreaks that could be a potential danger to the students, and these protocols can be adapted for COVID. I have written to the Commissioner of Health asking her to encourage local health departments to use their existing authority within school districts as needed.

13. What issues do you see in this area and how can you assist local districts in addressing school infrastructure needs in both SDA (Schools Development Authority) districts and regular operating districts? (answer type: Long Text)

Among the biggest issues I see in our local districts are the limitations on how federal funds can be used for capital projects in school districts -- we need to cut through the bureaucracy and red tape to make sure that our children have the best educational environments possible.

I can assist local districts in addressing school infrastructure needs by providing support to increase state funding for the Schools Development Authority, and explore creative solutions to help schools more easily finance capital projects.

As a legislator, will you support professional educators in their work with their students and avoid the temptation to mandate specific programs for every school district as we work to meet the individual needs of each student, school and district? I support the state creating resources and opportunities for school districts to best address issues like student mental health, and will continue to work with local educators and administrators within my district to ensure these supports are available. For example, in response to concerns raised by a local school district, I have pushed to protect and increase state funding for school-based youth services programs.

I believe that we should be assessing to ensure that each student has received an adequate education. Additionally, I will watch as DOE implements the newly enacted legislation to establish pilot programs for issuing limited certificates of eligibility with advanced standing and
